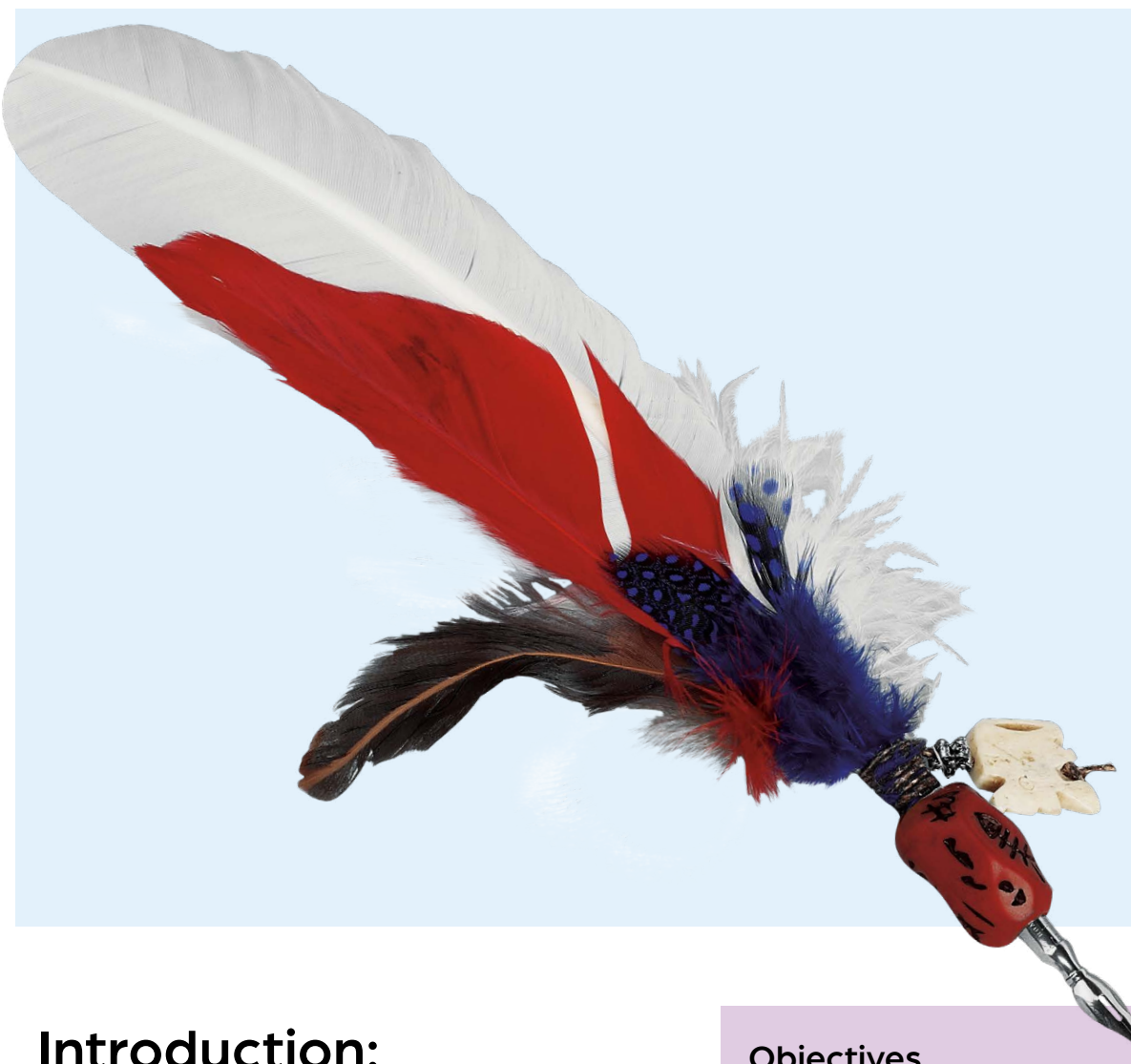




Handmade feather pens

Introduction:

Discuss design principles to help students make decisions concerning focal point or emphasis, variety, contrast, and unity. This will help incorporate art elements of line, shape, form, color, value, and texture when choosing embellishments. If multiple tools are being made, explore ways to create unity between them, such as repeating a color theme, textural feature, and/or decorative elements.

Objectives

Students will be able to...

- Explore the arts and crafts of ancient cultures.
- Invent and create pens that could be representative of that culture.
- Be encouraged to investigate alternative materials (found-objects), both natural and man-made, that could be incorporated into the design of their original pens.

Directions

1. Have students choose a large feather, thread, and decorative elements such as additional feathers, beads, colored wire, hemp cording, and found objects. Loosely arrange the materials to form a 3-D “model” of what the finished feather pen might look like.
2. Push the pen nib onto the end of the feather quill to determine a starting point for tying on additional feathers. Mark the feather at the top of pen nib. Do not glue the pen nib in place. Removal of the tip will allow for measuring and placement of embellishments such as beads and feathers.
Note: Broken pen nibs are easily replaced if not glued in place.
3. Pull a foot or two of thread through the beeswax several times to coat the surface and make it tacky. Wrap and overlap the thread several times around the feather quill above the pen nib.
4. Place one or two additional feathers on top of the thread and continue to wrap the thread tightly around the feather quills. Repeat as many times as necessary to achieve the desired results.
5. Tie off the thread with several knots and coat the thread with acrylic polymer or clear nail polish to secure the thread and make it water resistant. Let dry.

6. Slide beads onto the quill and over the thread to form a finger grip. Glue with epoxy, making sure to leave enough space for the pen nib to slide onto the quill.
Note: Beads will need to be drilled to slide over quill and thread.
7. Colored thread, hemp cord, wire, or leather lace can be added behind or between the beads by following the tying instructions described in steps 3 and 4. Further embellishment of the feather pen is limited only by the imagination of the student. Polish the pen nib with steel wool to help ink adhere and flow better. Slide pen nib on to feather quill.
